	The voting has now started and will close at midnight on Sunday 25th May. Following that, votes will be counted and independently verified by 30 th May.	
	After that, the outgoing committee will inform the Street Tree Partnership who has been appointed to the new Executive Chair.	
	Once the votes have been verified, on behalf of the Partnership, NE will write to the Chair to meet with them and discuss STAG involvement and representation on the Partnership.	NE

5.0	Strategy Refresh Outcomes 4 and 5	
	NE ran through Outcome Areas 4 and 5 of the strategy Discussion ■ CK noted that analysis of the distribution of all street trees across city, and their quality etc had been undertaken and that monitoring had been done. This had flagged a couple of areas where pollution was recognised as a problem especially around the train station. □ Action to check Air quality with SCC's Air Quality Team. This is always re traffic issues. Consider how mitigation / consideration of these issues can be added to the strategy. □ DW − Not just health outcomes, people are wanting EV charging points and this infrastructure is needing to be considered in relation to trees.
